The office has been already busy working on items for the 2024 Reassessment. The Assessor Clerk Michelle has been working on the rolling data verification. We verify data and take new photos on a rolling basis to ensure we are within the State Standards. This is also needed to receive State aid for Reassessments. The Assessor has been working on Validating the Sales that will be used. We are now starting to work on analysis of those sales.

There has been changes to the method of calculating the income for the Low income seniors. The Assessor has attended a webinar on this subject. However, there is still a lot to be clarified. These were changes that were made as part of the State Budget.

We are making progress on completing the water and wastewater CFAs and doing confidential testing of the drinking water in the potential district.

CSC:

We don't have the exact date yet, but the solar panels are on schedule to be installed at the end of this month. As I mentioned last month, there will be 50 panels installed on the court building roofs and some on the south facing roof of the old building. The panels are projected to generate 22,315.00 kWh of electricity every year offsetting 89% of the annual usage of both the Town Hall and the Garage. The entire cost will be covered by a grant from NYSERDA. In addition, the Town will benefit from a federal tax credit next year as well Plastic recycling is a big hit. Our last monthly run to drop them in Chatham yielded 15.5 pounds which may not seem like a lot but represented 8 big clear trash bags worth. We still have some issues with residents including items that are not accepted but we will continue to educate them. Our battery recycling program has now recycled 720 lbs and there's probably another 50lbs waiting to go out. The CSC will encourage attendees at Music in the Park to bring refillable water bottles and we will

provide 5 gallon water containers for refills and offer paper cups in an effort to cut down on single use plastic bottles. We hope that this will be the policy at all future Town events. As per the request of the Town Board at the last meeting, the EV charger was recalibrated by the CSC to charge \$.35/kWh instead of the free charges that NYSEG subsidized until June 30. The bike program received a donation of 22 bikes last week which means we are out of our new storage space already! We need help from the public to help find homes for those who need bikes. Comp Plan Update

1. Status of Comprehensive Plan Action Items

The ZRC will submit a proposal for the adoption of overlay zones to the Town Board. 5/10/23.

The board asked ZRC to hold off on any further submissions until 1/2025. The ZRC is currently developing proposed regulations for a ridgeline overlay. Very preliminary work has been done on one or more hamlet overlays. The ZRC is also working with the Shaker Preservation Committee on a possible Mount Lebanon historic overlay or other zoning mechanism.

The Town Board will direct the ZRC to strengthen existing large scale solar regulations to mitigate potential impacts to the environment and the Town's rural character as well as develop zoning regulations for wind energy and battery storage facilities. The ZRC will submit a proposal for these regulations.

A solar overlay zone is included in the zoning change package currently before the board. There may be some tweaks to what the board approved in March and this will be laid out in the July meeting, if needed. The ZRC deferred action on wind turbines and batteries for this cycle. Work on this will likely resume in the fall.

2. Other ZRC update:

Significant work is being done to shape up the zoning change package in order to have an introductory local law before the board for its July meeting. There is one outstanding item related to the solar overlay that is currently being worked on, as noted above. The committee is also engaged in the effort to preserve and protect resources on Mount Lebanon. The committee will meet at the end of July to "process" the input received at this week's special meeting of the Town Board, from a zoning perspective.

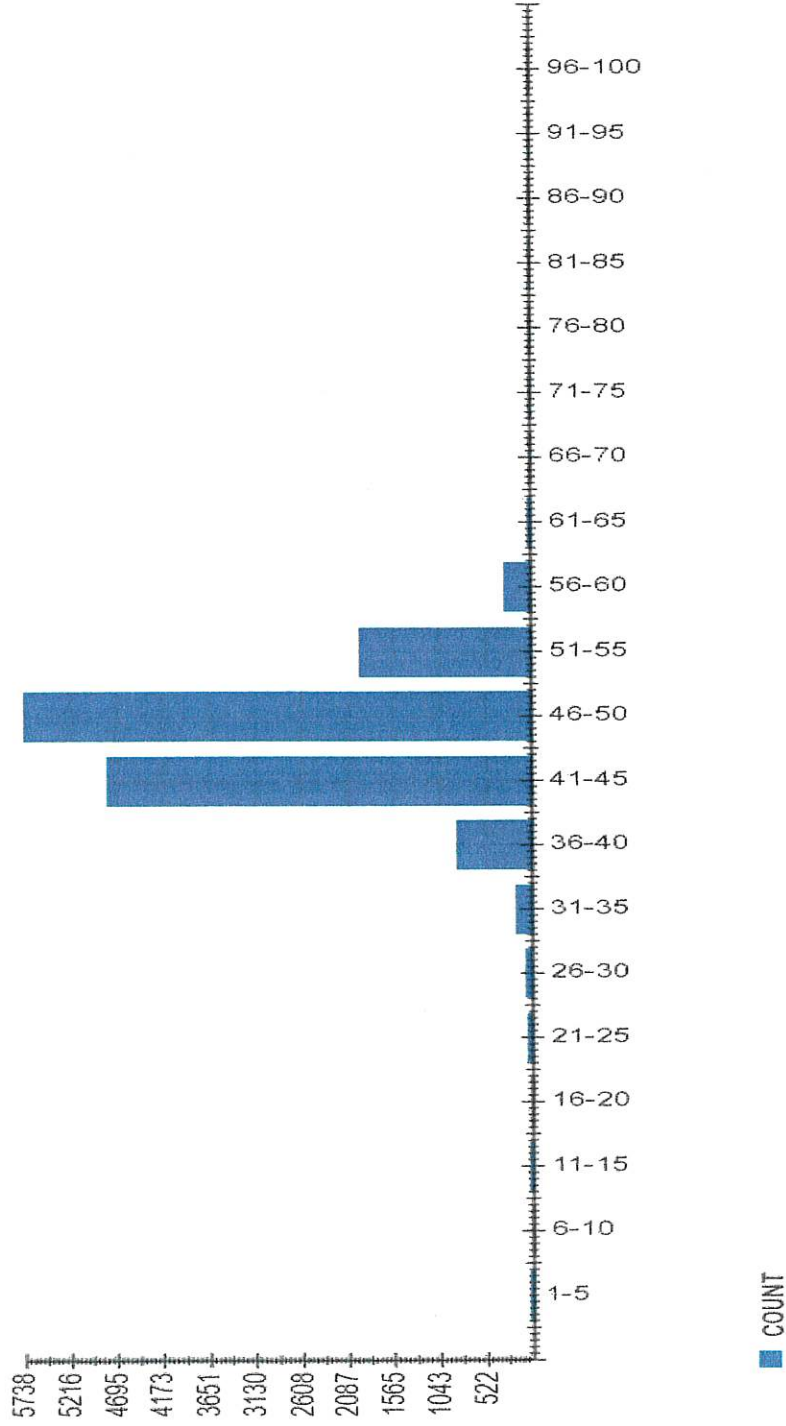

Count by Speed Range Report

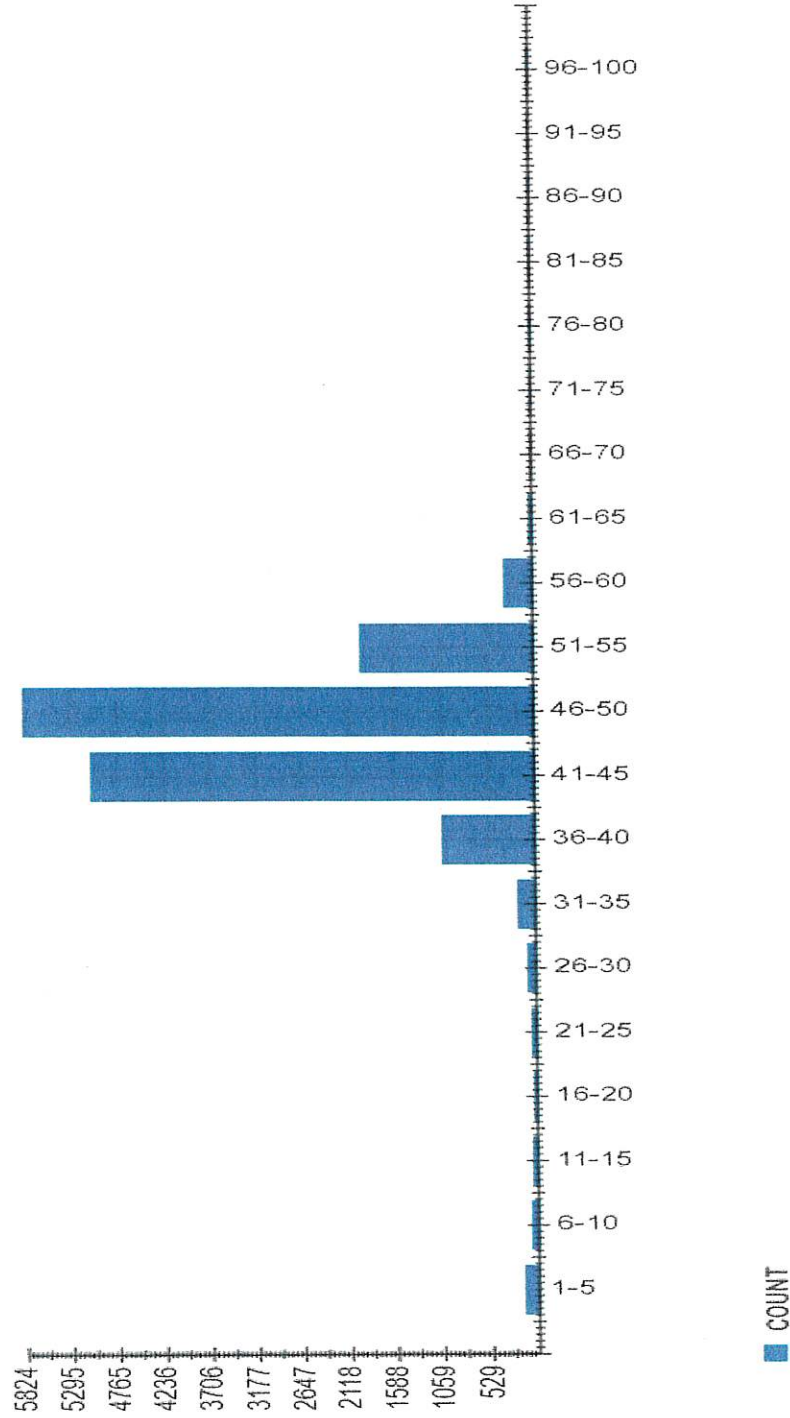

Count by Speed Range Report

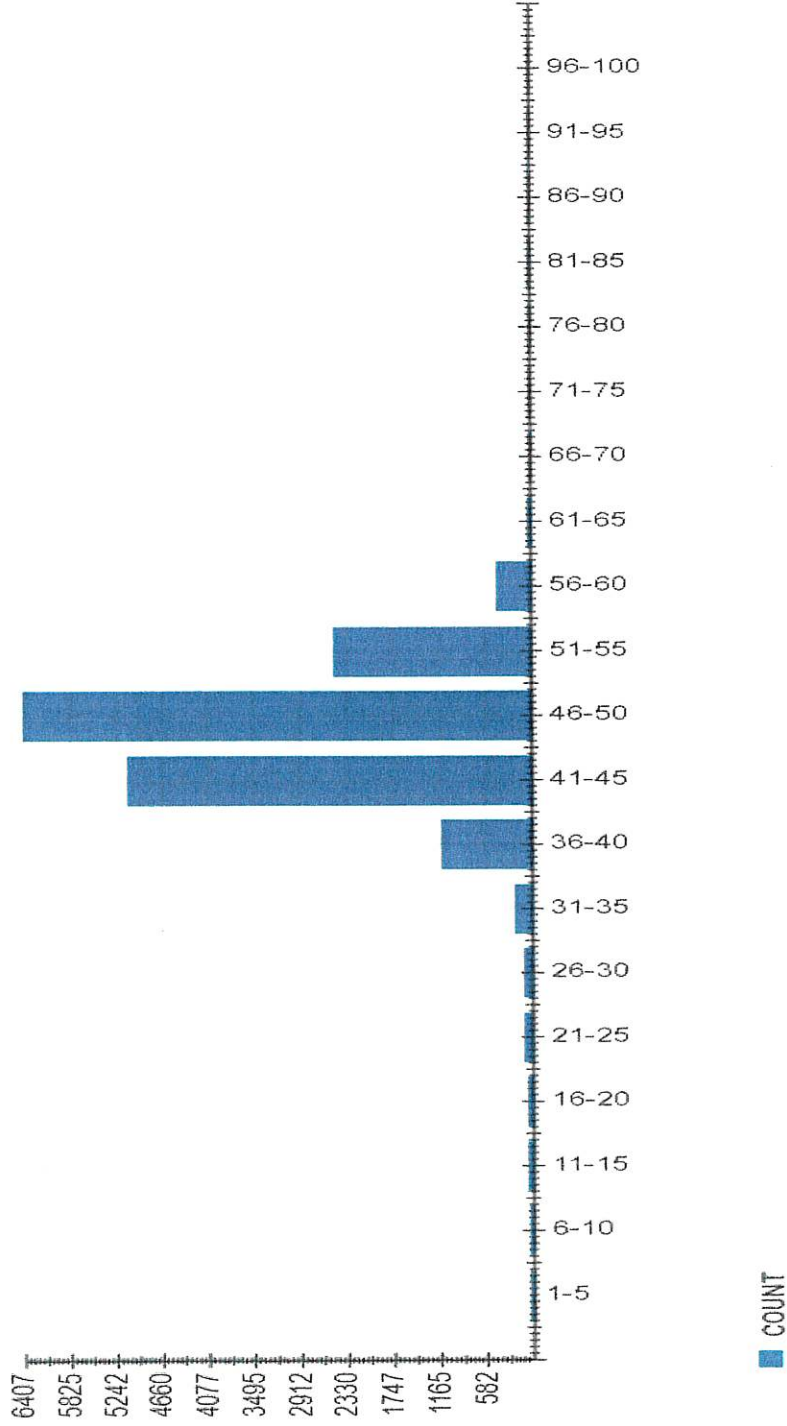
