CAC:

DWSP2/Water Testing Budget and Update

Of the \$30,000.00 allocated ARPA funds for water testing, approximately \$5,500.00 of it has been spent for testing costs, leaving approximately \$22,000 remaining to continue the testing and for other avenues to work on the plan.

Update on water testing and results

All those tested so far have their results and we are retesting those with positive results to assess if further mitigation is warranted. CAC is preparing some public education on water testing and water health for residents. So far over 63 tests have been done to date, the majority looking for bacteria coliform, E.Coli and the presence of nitrate. Several of the 63 are retests. Next steps include compiling and analyzing the results, and figuring out more implementation of the plan, with the assistance of the NYSDOH.

We are awaiting our status of DWSP2 approval from the DEC for the plan's implementation

Other

With resident Melba Kurman, the CAC is looking into NYSDEC Regenerate New York Forestry Cost Share Grant Program which offers monies to deal with invasives on private land. Melba will be applying for this grant next year and will bring back all the information she learns so we can determine next steps.

CSC:

To obtain points for the Climate Smart PE 7 Action: Climate Adaptation Plan, the CSC has to prepare a Climate Resilience Vision. Task Force members worked on this utilizing samples from other towns, materials from the workshops that Cornell Cooperative Extension organized last month, the survey results from New Lebanon residents and our own Comprehensive Plan. The attached document represents those efforts. We ask that the Town Board approve the Vision as written or make suggestions.

The CSC has joined the Hudson Valley Flood Resistance Network on behalf of the town. CSC Chair Steve Powers will attend a workshop on November 14 in Albany to hear how other towns in Hudson Valley have dealt with flooding issues.

The Partners for Climate Action grant proposal for the 6 additional heat pumps in Town Hall will be submitted by the Nov 21 deadline.

We are working on benchmarking the Town Hall and garage's energy consumption over the last year and should be able to present a report next month.

Our EV campaign continues. New Lebanon will get a \$5000 grant if we can document that residents have purchased an Electric Vehicle in the last year. We encourage residents who have purchased one to reach out to CSC Chair, Steve Powers- nlcscchair@gmail.com

Recreation Commission:

The recreation commission didn't meet in person this month. I spoke with the town Supervisor and then the town board about using our leftover annual budget and a bit more funding from the town to pay for a more permanent liner for the ice rink. The lowest quote was approved. The liner material has been delivered to the pavilion. Pete McCagg and Jesse Newton, with some volunteers, will be setting up the rink in the next few weeks. Hopefully, we'll have cold nights to allow for a freeze.

Seniors

The Office of the Aging Board meets this month, the last meeting of 2023. We will be discussing the development of a survey, especially designed for those over the age of 60 in Columbia County to find out their needs now and expected in the future and concerns about living in Columbia County. Once the information is obtained and collated the information will be shared with the County and Towns so they can design programs to meet those needs.

The State program of Office of the Aging continues to collect information about the needs to be covered by the State.

I attended the Office of the Aging Senior of the Year program online and got some interesting information. When the program started in 1963 by President Kennedy there were 17,000 people over the age of 65 in the State of New York, now there are over 17,000,000 and 1,000,000 of those provide 495,000,000 hours of volunteer service and save the economy \$13,000,000,000 in providing services. There were speeches from the Governor, Lt. Governor, the Congressman in charge of Senior Services and the Assemblywoman in charge of senior services as well as the Director of the Office of the Aging.

There were 100 nominees from across the state and their pictures were included in the program. Mr. Dietrech was selected for the Governor's Exemplary Volunteer Service award, for his service for over 60 years in Steuben County. His words of wisdom were that volunteerism is a team effort not just one person. The entire program is available on the NYSOFA web site if you are interested. Programs started recently are the 2023 HEAP program started 11/1, the HICAP program 10- 12/23 for Medicare programs, Holiday programs and gift giving via the STAR's program and assisting the Joesph Dwyer Veterans Food Pantry in

getting holiday meals to veterans and their families that are served by the pantry program.

Locally, the New Lebanon Seniors have had and will be having holiday parties with covered dish meals and a Holiday party 12/1. The New Lebanon Central School choir will have a concert rehearsal for the Seniors on 12/8 with the Seniors providing cookies in exchange for the concert.

There is bus trip on tap for 12/7 to a Holiday show by Buddy Holly.

The seniors recently partnered with the American Legion on the recent Taco night and Senior bake sale, everyone had a good time and will join again.

Seniors will be signing and sending Holiday cards to local nursing homes, the VA hospital and service members in Iraqi with the help of Gary Flarety, the VA rep for Columbia County. They will join other members of the community in the Town gift giving program.
