From the comp plan:

How we go about accomplishing each of these missions:

Housing

To find and/or procure grants or make it easier for others to find and/or procure grants for multi-use housing

- 1. new housing projects
- 2. repurposed housing
- 3. housing above commercial establishments

Goal: to attract young families by continuing to encourage the construction of "starter" and "ender" homes, while continuing to promote and improve New Lebanon's public school and its scenic natural beauty and outdoor recreational opportunities. The Town should strive to increase home ownership opportunities for working families and seniors, prioritizing the construction and renovation of for-purchase homes (or condos) at a variety of price points and sizes. Any changes to the Town's zoning should ensure that the location and density of any new housing units match the ability of the land to support them, and the community's frequently stated desire to preserve the Town's rural, small-town character.

Action Plan: Work with the ZRC to ensure that zoning will accommodate more housing to the town. New Lebanon has been designated a Pro-Housing Community – this will allow it to apply for some grants. We are working with Chris Brown of the Columbia County Housing Task Force to help overcome zoning roadblocks and find land suitable for Habitat for Humanity.

Health & Wellness

To disseminate information on physical and mental health. To find the means to bring better physical and mental health services to New Lebanon

- 1. Our new Queen of health information Erminia
- 2. Establishing a safe place for people to get these services

- 3. To work with other towns to get physical/mental health services here
- 4. To explore the idea of a mobile health unit that serves more than one town

Action Plan: To hold Health & Wellness fairs to disseminate information to residents

To work with potential pharmacy and health care center to help search for a new home for the potential pharmacy.

Lifestyle

To make it easier for our residents to access stores/services in New Lebanon. To have better communication for the residents to find out what is going on. To ease loneliness and isolation, particularly in the winter months

WHAT NEW LEBANON DOES FOR ITS SENIORS AND TO RETAIN YOUTH

New Lebanon is one of two Towns in Columbia County that has had an increase in population reflected in the Census. One of the biggest issues we face is the lack of affordable and available housing. New Lebanon has worked with realtors to help solve the issue of limited housing for its teachers. It recognized that it needed to provide activities for its young people and so has focused energies on several items including:

Shatford Park

Put in new Walking Trails that include fitness stations New skate park Grant for improved ADA/inclusive playground (new Playground committee making recommendations) Pickle ball court added to tennis courts Basketball court Playing field Renovating bathrooms to make them ADA compliant Music in the Park (suggest we make them weekly in the summer months) Renovating splash pad (under research/investigation) REC commission events: ice cream socials, community meals, Bingo for seniors

New Lebanon Community Center

A hub of New Lebanon where seniors can meet, all residents can gather and participate in playing pool, ping

pong, etc. Events, including pumpkin carving, community dinners, ice cream socials, bingo nights and more are held there. Now offers after school usage for Middle/High School students three days a week. It includes a popular free store which offers clothing, shoes, games, children's items, household items and more.
